STRATEGY STATEMENT AND PLANS FOR EXPENDITURE

We are using this catch up premium to:

- Provide children with Speech, Language and Communication support including some individualised plans (37% below expected standard in Nursery and Reception) [at a cost of £2,964](#)
- Provide very small group intervention of Read, Write Inc Phonics (41% Nursery children working below the expected standard, 47% of children working below expected standard Autumn 2020) [at a cost of £,2470](#)
- Additional member of staff employed in our Early Years Provision from Autumn 2020 - Summer 2021 [£7,404 \(expenditure to be mainly met by Pupil Premium income\)](#)
- Across the whole school to promote social interaction and team building to provide a Commando Joe inspired curriculum for at least half a term, per term (as identified by parents from the questionnaire in April 2020 and from pupils during class discussions in June 2020) [covered by Sports Premium funding](#)
- Across the school teachers to prioritise reading with pupils each week
- Across the school re-establishing friendships, including additional staff at break and lunchtimes to support social interaction [at a cost of £855](#)

The overall aims of this catch up premium strategy is

- To develop children's growth mindset and resilience
- To further support children who have struggled to access online learning due to their stage of development
- To raise the attainment of all pupils to close the gap created by COVID-19 school closures
