School Improvements

Lots of work has been carried out following the news of our successful bid for additional funding last term. The Early Years Toilets have been completely refurbished they are very swish!







We also have a fantastic new wooden fence at the bottom of our field too, giving extra security.



Our roof is also now watertight (where it wasn't!) and we now look forward to seeing all of the wooden cladding disappearing (mainly around the back of our building and on the front of our Early Years classroom) for new composite cladding over the coming weeks. The replacement PVC windows will be installed during the October half term now to minimise disturbance to learning - school is going to look so smart, keeping in line with our high expectations!

Start and Finishing times of the School Day

We continue to start the school day at 8.55am for the main school and Nursery at 9am, with the gate and doors opening at 8.45am for all children to be dropped off earlier if that helps (including Nursery children). At home time, the children are led out in their classes and dismissed by their teachers in specified areas of the playground at 3.15pm. Reception parents please can you collect children directly from their new classroom, not the playground - thank you!

Please can you also remember to let the office know if someone other than parents are picking up your child for safeguarding reasons. We will not let children go home with anyone that has not been authorised to, so please do not be offended if we need to contact parents first, if school has not been formally informed. We will also continue to ask parents of children who go on the bus to let us know of any change to days/childcare. Many thanks!
