New Starters

We look forward to welcoming our new Nursery children into school this week and look forward to getting to know you better in the coming months.

Y4 Robinwood Residential

We have again arranged for children in Year 4 to attend the fabulous Robinwood Activity Centre at Barhaugh Hall, Alston for three days and two nights in May (11th to 13th) with the Year 4 children from Whalton and Cambo. The children will have the opportunity to take part in a range of activities over the three days and make new friends ready for Middle School.

Although we do subsidise through our Sports Premium Grant, there will be a cost involved depending on the number of children attending; last year the cost was £210. To help, payments can be made in four monthly instalments prior to the visit through your child's School Gateway account.

Attendance

Many thanks for keeping us informed of absences related to illness or emergency appointments. We continue to follow our Attendance Policy and any unexplained absences will be followed up by the Office on the morning of the absence, so we know the whereabouts of your children to ensure that they are safe. There is still the 48 hour rule if your child has had a sickness bug.

With respect to leave of absence requests, unfortunately, unless exceptional, they are all deemed unauthorised. Again, we are so thankful for your honesty but need to ensure that we are fulfilling our statutory duty of emphasising the need for your children to be in school - every day counts for their learning and every day is planned for carefully by staff. Unfortunately, work will not be provided for in-term holidays. Missing continuous days will also lead to gaps in your child's learning which is planned carefully by your child's class teacher. Please look out for and use training days to get cheaper deals or long weekends which don't impact on your child's education. Many thanks for your continued support with this. We will be sending you an update of your child's current attendance from last term next week as we review our attendance figures. We aim for 96% attendance and are very proud of the fact that the vast majority of children achieve this.

The Education Welfare Officer visits us termly to monitor our attendance and if we feel that we need to support anyone to improve attendance, we will be in touch.

There are a series of model letters that we will need to send out too if your child hits a trigger point. Please understand that these are what we are being asked to do, but we also know that we have great relationships with yourselves, so please do not be put off by the wording of some of these!

Teaching and Learning

Newsletters outlining the term's topic and curriculum for each class will be sent home this week, so that you know what your child will be learning.

Although our next formal Pupil Progress Update Meetings for parents will be held next half term, please remember that you can make appointments to see your child's teacher at any point in the year to discuss your child's progress or if you have any questions.

Reception Places

Please remember to apply for your child's Reception place for this September by the deadline of 15th January. Even if you are currently attending our Nursery, you still need to apply formally.

The application process for a Reception school place in Northumberland is handled by the Northumberland County Council. The key dates for the 2026 intake are:

November 1, 2025: The online application portal opens.

January 15, 2026: The closing date for applications.

April 16, 2026: National Offer Day - you will find out which school your child has been offered a place at.


